North Beach

South Beach

J.D. Bush and Fred Lee plan to replace the damaged gate post. Rob Parker reported that the pontoon boats currently being stored on the South Beach would have to be removed before Beach Clean-Up Day.

Lake Conservation

John Miller reported that the pump had been repaired and that the draining of the dredge pool pond could begin. John has obtained 300 feet of new net to repair and rebuild the existing gill nets. He reports that the distance from the top of the dam to the bottom of the dam is eighteen feet, and that the last time he checked, there was a distance of thirteen feet from the top of the dam to the silt level.

Property Maintenance

Red Harris has been removing and cutting up tree limbs from the park and beach areas. Community members are urged to pitch in and help with this huge task. Red reports that a new basketball net has been installed, and that the tennis net would be up soon.





With freedom's holy light. Protect us by Thy might. Great God, our King!



Golden Egg Awards went to Marie Hobbs, Nicholas Jacobs, and Chad Sterns.


Youngest Child Award was won by Trey Birch.
