## BOARD OF DIRECTORS MONTHLY MEETING

The Monthly meeting of the Board of Directors was held March 6th with seven Board members and several guests attending. J. Hoone and J. Rhorman reported on work necessary at the North Side Beach, and Russell Koehring reported on the conditions of the South Side Beach. J. Hoone reported that a new breakaway rim has been installed at the basketball court. Fred Lee reported that the boats partially submerged in the lake will be removed before the summer season. The issue of the exposed sewer pipes on the lots bordering the lake will be taken up again with Mr. Ziegler, the engineer for Lawrence. Copies of the Lake Rules will be sent out to all members in the very near future. The Board members were made aware that four wheel drive vehicles have been driving over the area at the East end of the lake. Also, building developments in the surrounding area were discussed.

## DOWN MEMORY LANE IN THE SPRING OF 1970

"The U. S. Army Corp of Engineers are considering two possible locations for a flood control dam. One location would have considerable effect on Indian Lake, and the other would wipe out Indian Lake and the surrounding community. A Public Hearing will be held in the next 60 days."

Imagine lifting your morning paper and reading such news or hearing it on the local T.V. channels. That's what happened in the early spring of 1970. This news started a response in people not only from the lake, but Triboli Hills and the Mud Creek Valley. It resulted in one of the best grass roots campaigns ever witnessed. Between the three areas,

we counted 50 lawyers, dozens of engineers, many with experience in civil projects, and hundreds of willing workers. These men took time away from their work at their own expense, trailed around after the Army men, not letting them out of sight, and sat in Government offices all day, in case something would be filed that we would not know about. Everyone dug deep into their pockets, and we were able to hire an engineer who had designed over 250 dams for the U. S. Government in some of the most unlikely places in the world. He was able to convince the Corp of Engineers that the proposed dam would be nothing but mud flats for miles and miles. Because that dam was stopped, Indian Lake still exists and the Geist Area was developed.
