PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Fellow Residents of Indian Lake,

Your Board is proud to announce that the dredging project at the East End of the lake has been completed. The final dredging day was August 29th. The dredging equipment was removed on September 2nd. Your Board had a good working relationship with the men doing the dredging, and we feel they did an excellent job. The water depth has been significantly improved on the East End, and into Lake Papoose. The total cost for the dredging project was \$67,500. The Board used \$37,500 from the Cumulative Fund, and borrowed the other \$30,000 from Bank One, with a five year pay back.

The Board wants to thank all residents for tolerating the short hours that the North Beach was open this summer. With the dredging

equipment removed, the North Beach is now open during the day, as well as on the weekends.

REMINDERS ... Indian Lake stickers can be obtained from Jack Sweeney-823-4891. Please display these stickers in the rear windows of your vehicles. Our security men look for these stickers to determine if vehicles at the beaches, etc., belong to Association members.

Leaves that are raked up this fall should NOT be dumped into the lake. You can bag them and put them out on Wednesdays for the regular trash pick-up, or burn them in an approved container between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M.

Your Board asks that there be no dumping of any material in the East End where the trees are being cut. We have our hands full now with cleaning up that area, without the additional brush or tree trimmings from other properties.

Cutting of fire wood from the trees that were removed as a result of the dredging project is still going on. We have plenty of wood available FOR RESIDENTS ONLY. Call John Miller - 823-4602, or Mike Carter - 823-4396, to obtain the key for the gate at the East End.

The Board extends a warm welcome to all new residents who have moved into our community this year. Residents are invited to attend our monthly Board meetings, which are held the 2nd Tuesday of each month, at 7:30 P.M. Meeting locations are either Mildred French's home, or the Indian Lake Country Club. Call any Board member for the location if you plan to attend.

HELEN BRODIE'S ICE CREAM SOCIAL SAUCES

Chocolate Sauce

2 C sugar 1/3 C light Karo
1 C cocoa 1 can Carnation
1/2 C water Evaporated Milk
2 tsp vanilla

Blend sugar and cocoa in a sauce pan. Stir in water, and then add Karo. Cook until a few drops form a soft ball in cold water. Remove from heat. Add evaporated milk gradually. Add vanilla. Serve warm or cold. Makes 1 quart.



Butterscotch Sauce

1 1/2 C Karo - light 1/2 tsp salt
1 box light brown sugar 1 can Carnation Evaporated Milk
1 stick oleo

Boil together Karo, brown sugar, oleo, and salt until mixture is the consistency of light syrup. Cool some - add evaporated milk. Makes 1 quart.

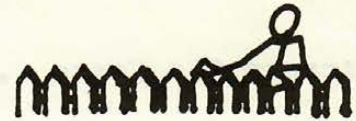
