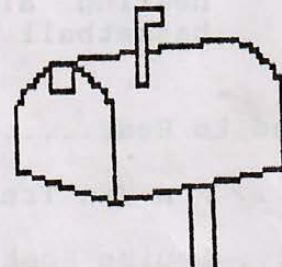

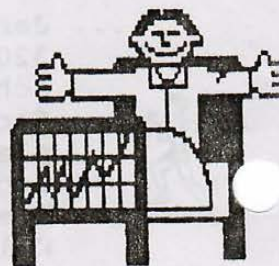
..... to the Eaton family who are moving into the Griswold home!

..... Will and Flo Peck on the recent loss of Will's mother.

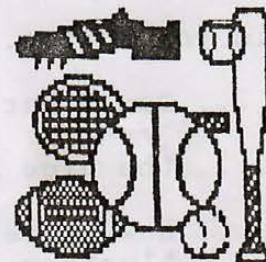
Did you know.....

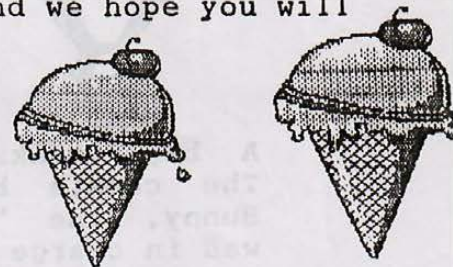

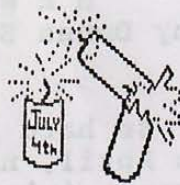
- ..... to all of YOU who are helping to make our neighborhood look better!

## The most Eggs found -



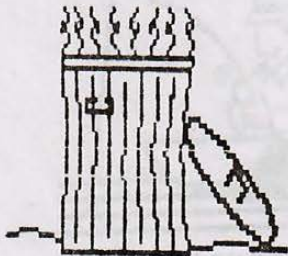
D.J. Connors won for 4 and under age group, finding 8 eggs.

Hope for good weather again next year!

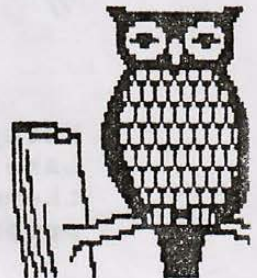


## N E W S

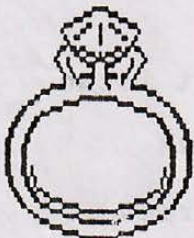
Dear Friends,

You have no idea how much I have been enjoying writing this little column lately. Last month, I had two wonderful weddings to tell you about and this time I have

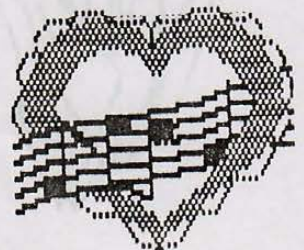

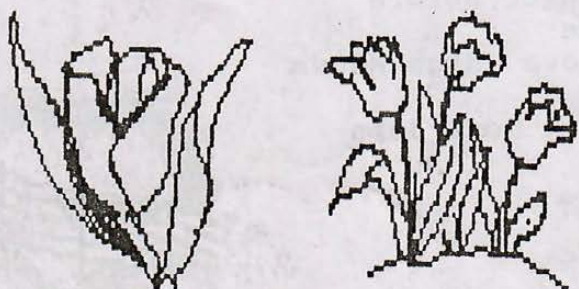
New faces at the South Beach were: Kathy Tucker, Mark Kirsch, Gary Crays and Tony Oeding.
