Treasurer's Report

Jack Sweeney presented the treasurer's report, quoting these figures;

Money Market Fund - A.G. Edwards - \$	49.34
Money Market Fund - Bank One -----	4,860.14
Checking Account Balance -----	8,003.91
Total -----	\$12,913.39

The income stream and upcoming bills were explained for 1988. After much discussion, your Board unanimously approved a payment of \$5,000.00 to be applied to the principle of our current outstanding loan. As a reminder, this five year loan at Bank One is the loan we took out to assist with the funding of the dredging project. Obviously it would be advantageous for the Association to pay off the debt sooner than the designated five year term, if possible.

North Beach

Joe Rohrman and John Taylor reported that a 20' X 30' tarp was purchased to cover and protect the picnic tables at the North Beach during winter. Joe and John are looking into purchasing new buoys for the swimming area. The old ones are in bad shape.

South Beach

J.D. Bush and Rob Parker are making plans to repair the gatepost at the South Beach.

Beach Clean-Up

Both the North and South Beach committees, in conjunction with the Women's Committee, will be setting a date in May for our annual Beach Clean-Up. The exact date will appear in the April Smoke Signal.

Dam

Fred Lee is getting estimates for constructing a fence along the west wall of the dam. The purpose of this fence is to reduce the hazard of someone falling over the dam in that area.

Lake Conservation

Mike Carter and John Miller are exploring methods of draining the standing water that is in the disposal site we used for silt drainage during the lake dredging. It appears that the standing water in that area would be a breeding ground for mosquitoes. Your Board of Directors will be discussing this situation at up-coming meetings.

Property Maintenance

Red Harris is in the process of evaluating the needs for the playground. I am seeking bids for rental of portable out-houses for the beaches, and am pricing dumpster service from different companies. There may be a chance to save money as well as eliminate the dumpster service problems we have had in the past.

Property Sales

At the annual meeting, the Association members present voted not to sell the narrow strip of land adjacent to the South Beach. At that same meeting the members present gave the Board the approval to go ahead with the sale of Park K. At the February Board meeting, the Board unanimously approved the seeking of bids for the sale of Park K. There will be a minimum bid of \$2000.00. Association members only may submit bids, in writing, to Joe Hoone, 10029 Indian Lake Blvd. N. Dr. Your Board will review all bids, and will bring the highest qualified bid to the entire Association membership for a vote. In order for sale of Association property to take place, 75% of the membership must approve the sale.

Recycling Program

The city of Lawrence, along with other communities, are looking into the benefits of a recycling program for paper, glass, and aluminum. A study committee was organized by Doug Reeser and Paul Whitehead,

both Lawrence City Councilmen-At-Large. I was asked to participate as a member of this committee. I will keep you informed of developments on the recycling study.

Meeting with the Mayor of Lawrence

Mayor Tom Schneider invited the heads of neighborhood associations to a meeting with the department heads of Lawrence on February 16th. The Mayor has made a commitment to meet with association representatives quarterly during the year. A specific question I brought up was when or if we will be getting city water. The answer was that we will have an answer in the fall of '88. If any resident has a question that you want me to raise at the next Mayor's meeting, call me at 823-6365, and I'll be happy to present your concerns.

Non-Resident Lake Use

There has been an increase in non-residents fishing at Indian Lake. It seems that a favorite access is at the dam by Red and Pat Harris' home. Fishermen are parking around the home, causing problems for the Harris family. Occasionally mail service has been disrupted because access to the Harris' mailbox was blocked. The Board discussed this situation and determined that the Lawrence Police will be contacted if the problem persists.

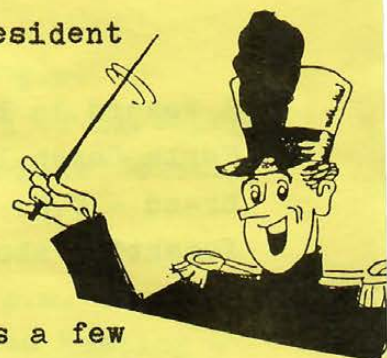
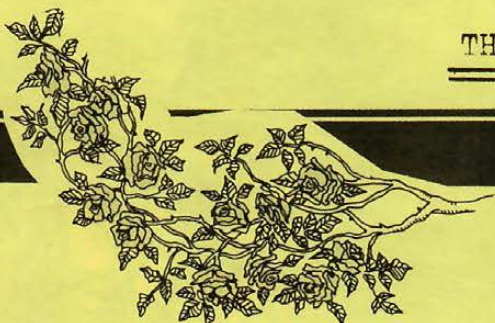
