BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING

The major item of business at the March board meeting was to consider the complaint of several residents that children on trail bikes have been causing damage to the various trails and beaches of the Indian Lake community. After lengthy discussion and consideration of all aspects of the problems, the board unanimously passed this resolution:

"Be it resolved that the Association hereby prohibits all motorcycles, mini-bikes, trail bikes, go-carts, ATV's, dune buggies, and any licensed, or unlicensed unauthorized vehicles from using or being operated upon beaches, trails, the lake bed, and all other commonly owned property of the Association."

Parents should make sure that their children understand this resolution.

Security Officer Bennett attended the board meeting and discussed his role in enforcing laws and Association rules.

The latest report on the dam project is that it should be completed "soon".

The next board meeting will be held April 21st. All Lake residents are welcome to attend.
