BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

Due to the unavoidable absences of several members, the Board did not have a meeting as scheduled, on October 21. However, a special meeting was called and held on November 4. At this meeting the Board approved the expenditure of a maximum of \$8,660. for repair and motorization of the dam gate and for digging a silt trap at the east end of the lake. An additional expense, the amount not yet determined, will be incurred to provide electrical service at the dam. Plans include a locked control box for the dam gate motor and a sentinel light on the dam. By unanimous vote Russell Koehring was appointed to the office of president for the remainder of the year. This action was necessitated by the resignation of Dick Smith who had sold his property in the Association.

On November 18 the Board held a regular meeting. A review of expected expenses for the remainder of the year indicated that the Association would close the year with a balance of about \$5,000. There was an in-depth discussion of the 1974 budget. A final review will be made at the December meeting. A list was made of possible nominees for board membership. Final selections will be made in December. There was also a discussion of the recommendations made in the report as well as other suggestions for lake improvement presented by individual members. All of these

possibilities will be presented at the annual meeting on January 14, 1974. An expense of \$500. was approved for dismantling the dredge even though there are not yet any prospective buyers for any of the equipment.
